If the Rhône Valley terrace of *galets* (rounded pebbles) that houses our vineyards could talk, it would surely tell the story of a winemaking family who, for 4 generations, has been patiently coaxing from its *terroir* the delicate yet powerful expression of an age-old vineyard, with its Mediterranean roots.

Along with preserving our winemaking heritage, we are also protecting here an endangered bird, the Little Bustard, that nests in the heart of our vineyards, which is situated in a Natura 2000 habitat.

On the border of the Costières de Nîmes and Côtes du Rhône appellations, where Arles, Nîmes and Avignon converge, the Château Font Barrière is a discreet jewel at the heart of a treasure of history.

My dark side refers to the trees that we plant as part of a vast agroforestry program. This wine from vines over 40 years old brings freshness and intensity of aromas. It is a faithful expression of our terroir and the wind that sweeps it.

Winet : Vin de France rouge 2023

Varietal: 100 % Cinsault

The age of vine : 40 years

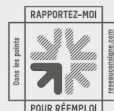
Soil : Pebbles

Yield : 50 hl/ ha

Vinification : Harvest at night, no sulphiting upon entering the cellar, gentle vinification in concrete vats with 1 light pumping over daily, fermentation at 22°C, short vatting (one week)

Ageing: 3 ans serve at 18°C

Tasting note : Light color with carmine reflections. Nose of morello cherry and pink berries. Fresh and elegant on the palate, the aromatic notes are identical to the nose. It is a subtle, discreet wine that invites cheerfulness.



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
